Fidget Toys

Over the last few weeks we have noticed an increase in pupils bringing items to school including items that the children tell us are 'fidget toys'. Please do not send items such as these into school. If your child needs any additional equipment, it will be included in their support plan and, as such, provided by school.

Although there are a very small number of pupils who benefit from this type of supportive measure, the vast majority of children do not need these items, and in fact they are detrimental to their learning. This is because this type of item can distract a pupil from their own learning, distract other pupils from their learning, and, if they go missing it causes lots of upset. So, please keep this type of item at home, where it is safe, and does not cause unnecessary distraction to your own child's and other's learning.




World Book Day Thursday 7th March 2024


