Healthy Start Digital Scheme

Just a reminder for our families eligible for Healthy Start, to sign up to the new digital scheme by the end of this month in order to continue receiving the service. Even if you are currently receiving the vouchers, you will not automatically be transferred to the new scheme—you must sign up at https://www.healthystart.nhs.uk/how-to -apply/. Vouchers will cease to be sent out later this month, so it is important that parents join the new version to avoid losing out.

Once signed up, you will receive a debit card topped up with the value previously received in voucher form. This can be spent at any shop that sells food and has a card reader, avoiding voucher use for anyone who may have felt uncomfortable in the past. This card will also act as proof of entitlement to free vitamins, so please show this card at your local distributor.

Qualify for the Healthy Start scheme if ; you're at least 10 weeks pregnant or you have at least one child that's under 4. In addition, you must be receiving any of the following: Child Tax Credit (only if your family's annual income is £16,190 or less), Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Pension Credit (which includes the child addition), Universal Credit (only if your family's take-home pay is £408 or less per month from employment) Any parents struggling to sign up/are digitally excluded, contact Thriving Kirklees 01484 415465
