SATs Parents Information Evening

Wednesday 27th April at 5:30pm

Parents and carers of pupils in years 2 and 6 are warmly invited into school to learn more about the statutory tests (SATs) their children will be undertaking next term.

Teachers will already have spoken at last week's parents' evening consultations about the individual targets their children need to be working on, so this evening is more about sharing information about what the tests involve and how school and home can work together to support our pupils at this time.

Any questions you may have about your child or the testing process can be discussed with staff, along with tips and advice about how to make the SATs process an enjoyable and stress-free experience for our children.

Parent / Carer Information Evening

It was lovely to see so many parents and carers last week at our parents' evening to share progress and attainment information about your children. If you are the parents of a child with additional needs, you should also have received their most recent IEP; please let the office know if your were unable to attend and so did not receive your copy.

Safeguarding, Wellbeing and Health and Safety

Lunchboxes—Just a reminder that all lunchboxes brought to school should not contain chocolate items or more than one packet of crisps. Also, pupils in Reception Class and KS1 are entitled to a free school lunch, which provides a hot and nutritious diet. If your child is currently in Reception or KS1 and brings a lunchbox, please consider moving them to a free school meal and save that money for a family treat.

Medication - a reminder about sending medication into school for your child. Parents and carers must bring all medication to the office and fill in a form to permit school to administer the dose, you must never leave it with your child. Calpol and other general pain relief remedies etc are usually not administered by school unless they are prescribed by a doctor. If you feel that your child requires pain relief, you are welcome to come into school and administer this yourself. This includes throat pastilles etc. Thank you.
