

I hope you've had a great week and are looking forward to the weekend. I wanted to share information about staffing arrangements for next year. We will be continuing with a number of initiatives that we have run for a few years, and have shown to have a positive impact on pupil progress and wellbeing.

Y1—Mrs Lawrence (Y1) will be leaving us, leaving a vacancy in Y1. I will update you as soon as I have further news about this position.

Y2—Mrs Clews

Y3 and Y4 will continue with the two-year, teacher cycle that we have implemented for a number of years. This means that pupils benefit from having continuity of staff who know them well and are able to ensure they meet or exceed expectations, and are able to provide individual pastoral support. Y3 will be taught by Miss Walker (currently Y4 teacher) and Y4 will be taught by Mrs Raimes.

In Y5 and Y6, our maths specialist, Mr Taylor, will deliver maths and our English specialist Ms Starrett will deliver reading, writing, spelling and grammar. Mr Pollitt will teach Y5 most afternoons. Best wishes, Mrs Travis.

Personal Development

One of our targets has been to increase opportunities for our children to visit the wider world outside school. Since Covid restrictions lifted, we have ensured that each class is given the chance to have enriching educational visits and trips that couldn't take place during the pandemic. Perimeter fence: I have some good news to share. The Diocese have agreed to fund a perimeter fence around the school site. Whilst there is always a timetabled staff team on duty when pupils are outside, a recent safeguarding audit identified that a fence would provide additional security. The fence will also hopefully reduce the amount of vandalism that occurs on-site during evenings and weekends. The work will take place during the summer break.

Taking Holiday In Term Time

Can we ask that all parents/carers please think carefully before taking your children out of school during term time. Taking children out of school in term time raises children's anxiety as it always results in them falling behind their peers.

Following new government legislation, Kirklees are also starting to fine when holiday is unauthorised.

If fines are issued by Kirklees, they are to each parent/carer for each child. School policy is only to authorise time out of school when it is to observe a religious festival or for some other exceptional circumstances. School's Attendance Policy can be found on the school website.

Well done to all our Year Six pupils who were awesome whilst sitting their SATs tests last week They all showed determination, enthusiasm and perseverance during their tests and some pupils shared with staff that they had even enjoyed the testing experience! 
Linthwaite 'Leadboilers' Festival

Saturday July 2nd 2022



Well done team!








